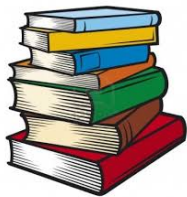

Trip to England

Over spring break, thirty-eight students from St. Elizabeth High School and eight chaperones explored England. Many students experienced underground metro transportation for the first time by riding the Tube to various London destinations.

Two highlights of the trip were Easter mass at Westminster Cathedral and a tour of the British Museum. "I liked that the British Museum was sectioned off into different eras of history and different civilizations," said senior Joey Pritchard. Students had an opportunity to participate in a theatre workshop and to see three West End productions including the hit musical *42nd Street*. Fans of British football watched the Aston Villa vs. Fulham soccer match.

Other locations of special interest were the London Tower, Buckingham Palace, Stonehenge, and the hot springs beneath the historic Roman Baths. Before returning to Heathrow Airport for their flight home, students toured Westminster Abbey. "Personally, I was overwhelmed by the grandeur of it all. It's remarkable to know we walked where people like Charles Darwin and Geoffrey Chaucer are laid to rest," said chaperone Kammass Murphy who maintained a blog throughout the journey.
