Girl Scout Award



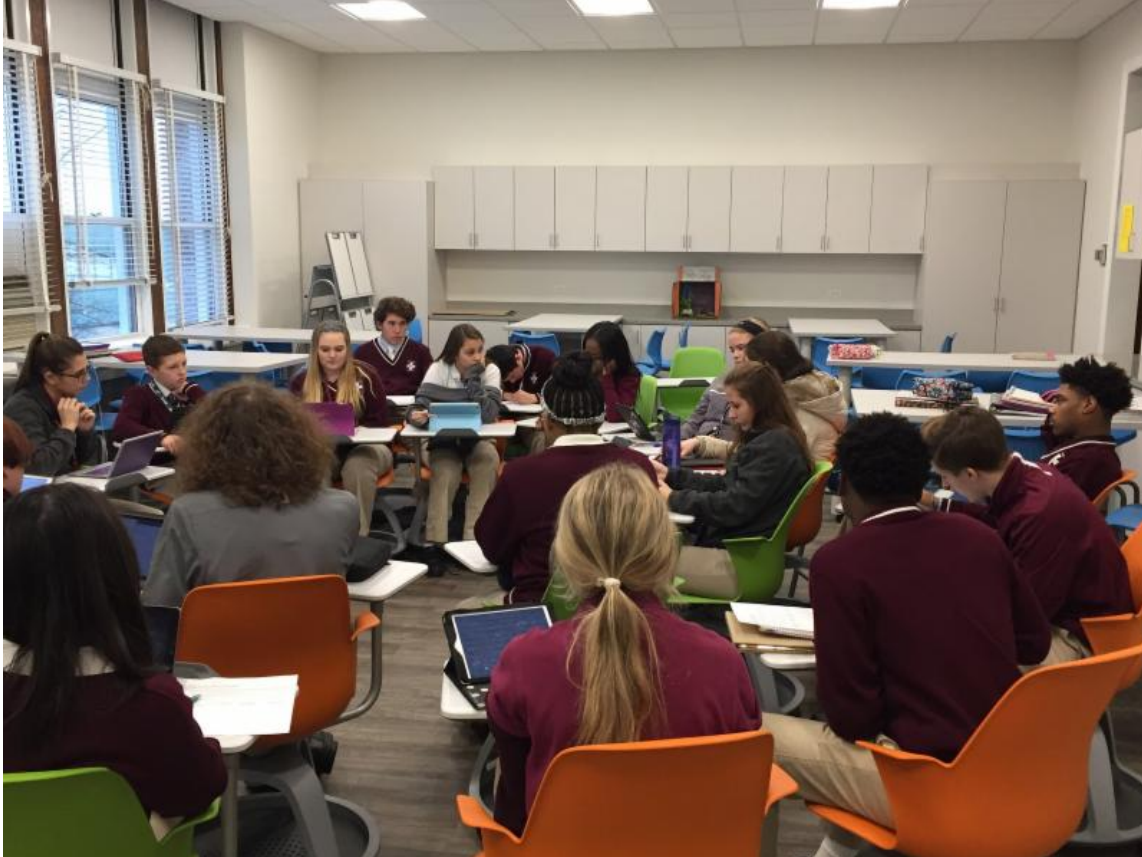
