ERB WrAP Testing for Juniors and Freshmen

Throughout the week of February 13th all students in grade 11 and in grade 9 will once again participate in the annual ERB WrAP (Writing Assessment Program) testing administered by the members of the English department. Teachers will conduct the testing, designed to measure growth in student

writing ability between grades 9 and 11, during regularly scheduled class periods. WrAP asks students to respond to a writing prompt in two timed writing sessions administered over consecutive days-closely replicating the natural writing process of drafting, revising, and completing a final version. The test, scored both holistically and analytically, will also provide the department with detailed feedback about an individual student's strengths and weaknesses.

Class Scheduling for 2017-2018

Preliminary scheduling for the 2017-2018 school year has commenced. Beginning on Tuesday, February 7th, the juniors, sophomores and freshman classes have each met with Mrs. Mangan, Academic Dean, in the BPAC for a short presentation about school and state requirements, elective choices and VHS collaborative class offerings for next year. They have been given schedule papers and information to share with parents and guardians about the ongoing course selection process. Throughout the month, students may confer with counselors, teachers and the Academic Dean to have scheduling questions answered and should refer to course descriptions under the Academics section on www.sehs.org. Preliminary course selection papers are due in the Academic Office by February 22nd.
